Cooperative Program—The Heart of Southern Baptist Missions and Ministries

What does it mean to be Southern Baptist? I am reminded that even some of us who have been Southern Baptists for much of their lives may not see the big picture.

There are over 47,000 churches in fellowship together as Southern Baptists. And while large churches get a lot of the attention, we are still a convention made up primarily of small churches. The average church will have 80-100 people in attendance on Sunday morning.

I have heard numerous comments about Southern Baptists, such as: "Nashville tells every preacher what to preach." Or, "Nashville tells us what to believe, or what a church should do." One of the things we need to remember about being Southern Baptist is that our relationships between churches, associations, state conventions and the national convention is completely cooperative, with the local church as the ultimate authority. Neither the associations nor state and national conventions have the power to tell any church how to function. We work together in cooperative agreement to do kingdom work.

As I see it, there are three things that are priorities as Southern Baptists:

We are Christ-focused. As followers of Jesus Christ, we believe that there is no other way to be saved than through faith in Christ. In John 14:6 Jesus makes it

clear that there is no other way to get to Heaven. We stand firm on this truth and proclaim this message to the world, so that every person can have the chance to hear this truth and be saved.

We are also Bible-based. Southern Baptists believe the Bible is God's Word. Scripture as it is understood and interpreted by each church is the basis for guiding what and how it does ministry.

We are Missions-minded. Maybe the greatest accomplishment of Southern Baptists in our almost 175 year history is the impact we have made in the world through our missions efforts. backbone to mission work in the last 100 years has been the Cooperative Program. This is a giving program where each church gives into one channel and the money is then divided to the different entities as determined by the state convention and SBC budgets voted on each year at the annual conventions. Add in the annual missions offerings, such as the Lottie Moon Offering and the Annie Armstrong offering, and we are able to do missions around the world.

At this moment the churches giving to the Cooperative Program and/or the missions offerings are supporting 3,671 missionaries in foreign countries, and 5,097 missionaries in North America. The International Mission Board estimates that

it takes about \$60,000/yr. to keep a missionary on the field. Obviously, it would be beyond the ability of most churches to send a missionary as an individual church, but working together we are able to send thousands.

One entity that does not get much of the Cooperative Program funds is the local association. Our association receives less than \$5,000 annually from the Tennessee Baptist Convention. McMinn-Meigs Association's operating funds are provided by the churches in the association.

Throughout the book of Acts we see churches working together to be on mission carrying out the commission Jesus gave us. May we continue to work together to carry the message of Jesus Christ to our own neighborhoods as well as to the far reaches of the world.

mission education, tithing, protection of missionaries' children, consistent prayer for missions, a successful publishing business, expansion of Southern Baptist territory, organization of black Baptist women and ministries to immigrants, just to name a few of the "little things". Oh, to be strong in just one or two areas like mission education or consistent prayer for missions would be my desire. God had His Hand on her. So, one question from Miss Annie, "What is the marching order God has given you?" Each one of us will have a different answer but each will be important.

It's that time of year when Christian Builders "ramps up". Actually, we build ramps year round, in the cold and the heat. Some of you may not know how

Christian Builders is funded. As for the ramp materials, as much as we can, we ask the clients to apply for a grant from Mid TN United Cerebral Palsy. They administrate federal grants for ramps. However, we build ramps at times that cost more than the grant provides. Then we dip into our own coffers to make up the difference.

There is also the cost of our tool maintenance, which is not covered by grant funds, and also the grab bars and railings we do for the handicapped.

Christian Builders does not have a line item in the association budget. We operate solely on donations. We have some 60 something churches in our association. If every church would consider a \$100 donation to Christian Builders we would add \$6000 to our funds, and we could use that yearly if you would consider an annual gift. Some churches can do more than that.

As always, if you know of a disabled person that needs a ramp, don't hesitate to tell them about us. And, consider volunteering to help! We can use skilled and unskilled people. God Bless!
