From Brother Mike...

As we have been preparing for revival, I had a link come across in an email which led to a lecture series by one of my Seminary professors, Dr. Roy Fish. The series was on the Great Awakenings in our nation. I listened through most all of the series and was reminded once again how God works in the small and seemingly insignificant parts of our world. Our society today often judges the significance and worth of something by how big it is. This often has been applied to churches. Our culture celebrates the large church and especially the large church pastor. I believe we are being led astray by such thinking. I am not saying the large churches and large church pastors are bad, because many of them accomplish great work in God's Kingdom. But this should never lead us to forget the contribution of the smaller churches and the pastors of those churches.

Overall, the Southern Baptist Convention is still a convention made up predominantly of small churches. (Small churches are often defined as churches with worship attendance of 75-100.) Many have adopted the "bigger is better" attitude and think small churches can't do much. We need to get away from that thinking. The missions endeavor the SBC supports is done primarily by these small churches. We are starting to see evidence of a move of people away from the larger churches back to smaller churches. I don't know if this is going to become a big trend, but it is clear that the problems that have arisen in the church world recently are opening people's eyes to the reality that bigger is not always better.

Here are some of the things that small churches can do. Small churches can develop good relationships. The members can get to know their pastor and the pastor will know them. This is often not the case in large churches. There is also an element of accountability in these relationships. Small churches can move quickly to interact with their community. Small churches can be less intimidating to the unchurched who are not familiar with attending church services. Small churches often develop a larger percentage of people who are involved in

ministry rather than just sitting in the pew. One of the things I was reminded of in the lecture series I mentioned is the Great Awakenings often began with small, insignificant people and churches. Never say God can't use us. Let us have a great faith that God can do all things and we can be a part of His mighty work.
